
Sharing the grace of God with one another and the world around us.

our fear that keeps us from sharing your compassion.



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About Today's Music: We welcome Dave Clark on saxophone, Luciano Medina and Myles Hayden on percussion, Samuel Libra on organ and piano, our Choir, and members of the Youth Worship Arts Team as we celebrate Advent with a mixture of traditional hymns and carols, some of which are set to jazz chords and stylings. Hope for Resolution is a song written by Paul Caldwell and Sean Ivory and dedicated to Nelson Mandela and F.W. de Klerk in the wake of the dissolving of the Apartheid state in South Africa. A perfect offering for Peace Sunday, the notes in the score tell us why: In its juxtaposition of a European chant melody and an anti-Apartheid songs from South Africa, this piece is a celebration of diversity. The arrangement reflects respect for divergent musical styles and points toward our innate (though sometimes neglected) potential for peaceful coexistence. Will Todd, an English composer and jazz musician, has set Let All Mortal Flesh in a fresh music idiom, utilizing its ascending chant line with modern chords and rhythms. Similarly, the postlude is an updated take on an ancient melody by American composer Adolphus Hailstork, who teaches composition at Old Dominion University. It captures our restless Advent anticipation of Christ's birth in its jagged syncopations and uneasy 5/4 meter.
