OUR GUEST RENEWAL PREACHER

Rev. Dr. Tom Tewell has loved being pastor of four wonderful congregations during his forty-five years in pastoral ministry, including Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church in New York City, that he served on September 11, 2001, and the 5,000-member Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church in Houston, Texas. In this current chapter of life, he thoroughly enjoys being a pastor to pastors, a preacher in residence at the San Marino Community Church in suburban Los Angeles, and, most of all, a husband, dad, and granddad to seven grandchildren between the ages of seven and twenty-five!

A graduate of Princeton Seminary, where he served as a Trustee for 15 years, Tom received a Doctor of Ministry degree from Drew Theological School and has been awarded two honorary doctorates from Grove City College in Pennsylvania, and Muskingum University, his alma mater. Tom has received numerous awards for his social justice ministry, particularly with the homeless in NYC, and for his preaching. Tom continues to enjoy being invited to preach on college and seminary campuses, and in congregations and conference centers across America. In addition, Tom loves mentoring 40 young Presbyterian Church preachers through the Zick Preaching Scholar Program that helps good preachers improve the quality of their preaching.



An entrepreneur at heart, Tom is also the Founder of Macedonian Ministry, (The Ministry Collaborative) a leadership development and church renewal ministry that he and the late Atlanta Developer, Tom Cousins started together in 2008. The Macedonian Ministry just enrolled their 1,400th pastor and congregation representing 25 different Christian denominations! Tom and his wife Suzanne have been married for over 50 years and live in Claremont, California, close to their three youngest grandchildren, under the age of ten.

NOTE ABOUT TODAY'S AFFIRMATION OF FAITH: The Confession of 1967 was written by the then "Northern" Presbyterian Church as response to the social and cultural volatility of the 1960s. 


The original French text, sometimes attributed to John Calvin, seems to be a Protestant reworking of a Roman Catholic hymn, not a typical practice for him. Yet this text and tune (adapted from GENEVAN 124) clearly date from the early years of the Reformed tradition.

Long before Isaac Watts began to Christianize the Psalms, Martin Luther had already done so when he created the text and tune for this, his most famous hymn, which is based on Psalm 46. Luther encouraged metrical versions of psalms as well as chanted psalms and new hymns.
