Taylor Caldwell's book *The Listener* was released in 1960 – before I was born. Some works remain timeless because in them we find someone who writes as if they knew us. *The Listener* treks alongside 15 visitors as they arrive at a simple building where someone promises to listen. No one really knows the mysterious listener's identity. Each one finds something they need when they visit the listener - more importantly, they find someone they need.

When a loved one dies, we miss their voice, their presence, their listening, and their hearing. At Second Presbyterian, a grief group meets on the first and third Wednesdays of each month from 11:30-12:30 PM led by Elizabeth Clay. Listeners make up the group. And sharers too.

When I listen to others' pain, laughter, and vulnerabilities,I often discover myself in others' voices. Listening to others often helps me hear myself. When I've heard myself, I'm often able to then give voice to my joys and pains with the hope that another will listen to me. Giving and receiving the gifts of listening and sharing deepen our connections while helping us sort out trouble specifically the trouble caused by the death of a loved one.

The grief group is open to everyone. Get in touch with Elizabeth if you're interested - give the gift of listening and sharing along your journey.



### Weekday School

Welcome to the 2022-23 school year! It has been pure delight to welcome our new students and reconnect with old friends who have all grown so much over the summer. It was also my pleasure to watch the excitement build in our teachers as they intentionally prepared their classrooms for learning and connection. A school year is a special time span, and a classroom a sacred space. In a dynamic learning environment, children make meaning of the world and create bigger maps of understanding together in a relational context. Young children use their whole bodies in a hundred different ways to investigate life and what it is to be human. By honoring these processes and creating spaces and rhythms for them within the classroom, teachers reflect back to children how intelligent and capable they are.

As children transition from summer home life into school rhythms, it can take up to several weeks for some to feel comfortable with the change. This is normal and expected. Children have to build their stamina back up, adjust their sleep schedules, and acclimate to new relationships and routines. Our teachers comfort any child experiencing big emotions through the transition and guide them toward feeling safe and settled. Classmates are a big help, too, as they invite each other to play, laugh, and explore their new surroundings. Cultivating strong home-school connections unites children's two worlds and provides a sense of their families being with them in their school days, as well. We have invited our families to share their traditions, cultural heritage, talents and time in their children's classrooms and on our campus.

I am eager for the possibilities this new year offers. In June, I went to the first in-person North America Reggio Emilia Alliance (NAREA) conference since the pandemic began. The early childhood schools of Reggio Emilia, Italy are our strongest educational influences. It was a true joy to have an immersive time with the Italian educators once again. I brought back much inspiration and excitement, particularly around the idea of learning always taking place in a relational context: with other people, the natural world and the systems that govern our planet. We also explored the importance of beauty in education and how to use digital tools for creative exploration with children. I look forward to digging into these ideas and seeing what magic arises in our school this year.

August 18, 2022 Session Meeting

Audit: The church audit was performed on sight by independent auditor, Monroe Shine. The opinion of the auditor is: "We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Second Presbyterian Church of Louisville, which comprise the statements of financial position as of December 31, 2021 and 2020, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements".

Financial Report: Pledges for 2022 received in July were \$116k, bringing the total collected in 2022 to \$69k. Pledges collected to date are 89% of MAP (Ministry Action Plan) and 97% of actual 2021. Total 2022 pledge income is \$779k and includes \$149k of pre-paid 2022 pledges collected at year end 2021. From the Treasurer's Report: YTD income is \$197,788 more than the same period 2021. YTD expenses are \$48,946 more than the same period 2021. Property expense is anticipated to exceed budget by approximately \$20k. Actual activity is tracking well with MAP. Balance Sheet Highlights: Cash at US Bank includes \$522,472 in restricted funds including \$169k set aside for technology. Cash net of restricted funds is sufficient to cover less than one month of budgeted expenses. WDS (Weekday School) reserves of \$1.4MM include over \$500M of Federal Funds received during Covid and are earmarked for employee salaries and retention and equipment for WDS.

Report from APNC (Associate Pastor Nominating Committee): The committee has interviewed and are considering 3 quality candidates for the position of Associate Pastor. They expect that the process of selecting a prospect will take approximately another month and a half.

### Associate Pastor Nominating Committee Update

Our committee continued to meet regularly throughout the summer. We have contacted several seminaries and presbyters seeking recommendations for candidates as well as using the potential matches provided by the PC USA Church Leadership Council website. In addition, we have purchased ads in the job opportunities section in several Presbyterian publications. To date, we have reviewed over 60 candidates and are now beginning the interview phase of those candidates that we feel may be suited for our call. We would appreciate your prayers and support as we continue in this process.
